Your 2023–2024 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. In this process, New York Tech's Office of Financial Aid will be comparing information from your FAFSA with copies of your (and your spouse's or parents') tax information as provided by the IRS. The law states that we have the right to ask you for this information before awarding federal aid (CFR 668.51). If there are differences between your FAFSA data and other requested documents, you or New York Tech may need to make corrections.

1. Please **complete, sign, and return** this worksheet (see contact information below), along with any other documentation requested by the Office of Financial Aid.
2. If you did not enter your tax information on your FAFSA through the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (DRT) or you used the IRS DRT and made subsequent corrections to your return, you must submit a **Tax Return Transcript**. To obtain a Tax Return Transcript from the IRS, please visit irs.gov and click "Get My Tax Records." You may also call 800.908.9946 or order one by mail using IRS Form 4506-T (Request for Transcript of Tax Return). There is no fee for a transcript. Non-tax filers may be asked to submit a "Verification of Non-filing" letter by submitting Form 4506-T. The IRS will then send the non-tax filer a "Verification of Non-filing" letter. The non-tax filer will then send the actual "Verification of Non-filing" letter to New York Tech.
3. Please submit the transcript to New York Tech's Office of Financial Aid with your full name and student ID clearly marked on each page. If you are unable to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (DRT) or obtain a Tax Return Transcript, you may submit a signed copy of the 2021 income tax return and all applicable schedules.
